The challenge

Endress+Hauser, a leading supplier of products, solutions and services for industrial process technology, was looking for a better way of managing information. While today, millions of users worldwide have adopted MindManager to address this common business issue, Endress+Hauser, a family-run business that prides itself on always being at the cutting edge of IT, first began using MindManager mapping software more than 17 years ago.

Juergen Ekert, Head of the Project Office at Endress+Hauser, recognized that effective information management would not be an easy challenge to solve with more than 13,000 people worldwide, spanning multiple time zones and cultures. Add to this that the company culture focused on working closely with its international customers in an open and flexible manner. Juergen did not want any new software tool introduced to negatively impact this strong culture of personal accountability but also wanted to ensure that an environment of innovation did not become restricted in any way. Each year, about 7 percent of the company's revenue is channelled into Research and Development and a total of 7,000 active patents bear witness to the innovative spirit of Endress+Hauser.

The solution

Juergen decided to introduce MindManager as a supporting tool in project management at Endress+Hauser. He had become familiar with the software while still a student and felt that it offered many benefits for project-based working and as a collaboration tool.

"As part of the everyday reality of business life, people constantly need to prepare for appointments and to document meetings – tasks that no-one enjoys doing, but can be carried out in MindManager as an ancillary activity." In fact, Juergen Ekert notes that the software makes these tasks so easy that they almost do it for themselves! Beyond project management, Juergen has seen the tool used for a wide variety of key processes. Endress+Hauser uses the visualisation and structuring facilities of MindManager since 17 years. The key rationale for its implementation was, and still remains, that the map format not only makes it possible to structure complex content in a manner that is easily understood, but it also enables staff to more effectively execute their projects.

The results

Today, the employees of Endress+Hauser make use of the software to perform a diverse range of tasks. Juergen, for example, uses it to prepare and carry out meetings and then uses the relevant map in order to immediately draw up the minutes. What's more, he also uses this solution to compile reference documents and other critical documentation for corporate knowledge management. In addition, he has created a large number of templates for items such as training workshops, brainstorming sessions, employee interviews and much more, that he can draw upon quickly.

"The particular features that help us get ahead quickly are the filtering function, prioritising, displaying connections and the ability to visualise complex matters using shapes and colours," shares Juergen.

Though he can't quantify the many benefits, he is convinced that the company's projects run so smoothly due to the fact that they are planned and implemented using MindManager.
